From Stop-Gap Measures to Long-Term Solutions:

ABCD President/CEO John J. Drew urges vision, collaboration

After 18 months of a global health crisis, our country and the world have been conditioned to respond. We train our focus on the next milestone in the hope that it will lead to a meaningful turnaround.

But it's time for leaders to transition from a reactive to a proactive mindset in order to make urgent matters manageable and, crucially, to work together to develop long-term solutions to poverty and suffering.

Case in point: days after the federal eviction moratorium expired on July 31st, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ordered its extension through October 3rd. On August 26th, the U.S. Supreme Court rejected that order stating that the CDC had exceeded its authority. Consequently, evictions can resume.

Statewide Virtual Job Fair Brings Employers and Job Seekers Together

Although the unemployment rate in Massachusetts is just 4.9 percent, that figure fails to signal the uneven challenges of the economic recovery. In the first two quarters of 2021 nationwide, Hispanics were still nearly 70 percent more likely to face unemployment than white workers, while Black workers were twice as likely to face unemployment as whites.

To address the misalignment of workers and available jobs, the MassHire Department of Career Services and the Massachusetts Executive Office of Labor and Workforce Development held a virtual job fair August 16 – 20th that brought together jobseekers and employers to fill positions in such fields as healthcare, education, information technology, and building services.

ABCD hosts early voting in Boston on September 4 & 5

Your vote counts – perhaps now more than ever. Historically, municipal elections don't drive big voter turnout, but in truth, the people who become mayors, city councilors, school committee members, and so on, have a very real impact on your day-to-day life. They determine policy and budgets for education, police, construction, and more.

Vote by mail

In July 2021, a state law was passed allowing voting by mail in all state and local elections through December 15, 2021.
