The significant and historic Child Tax Credit that this year lifted more than 3.6 million children in America out of poverty must be extended beyond December 2021.

EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT BECOMES AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM

Congress recently created the Affordable Connectivity Program, a long-term, \$14 billion program, which replaces the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program as of December 31, 2021. This investment in broadband affordability will help ensure incomeeligible households can afford the internet connections we need for work, school, health care and more for a long time.

The benefit will provide a discount of up to \$30 per month toward internet service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.
