## Congratulations to our 2019 graduates



Anticipation fills each corner of the room as streamers hang next to banners that read "Congratulations Graduate" behind balloons with "Class of 2019" written on them. Family members sit in the audience as they anxiously wait for their graduate to come out. All of their hard work, sacrifices and choices have led to this moment – Graduation Day! Getting to the finish line of their high school career despite adversity is what these unique students have accomplished.

Graduation season evokes different meanings for many people but for students at Ostiguy High it means they have not only overcome but they have surpassed even their own expectations. Ostiguy is a recovery high school that integrates an accredited high school curriculum with clinical and supportive services for its students. Guided by staff, students are empowered with tools and resources to aid in their journey of recovery from substance abuse. Ostiguy High's 2019 graduating class consisted of eight students from varying backgrounds who depended on each other and staff to get their high school diploma.

A few miles away in Roxbury at ABCD University High School (UHS) the 2019 graduating cohort consisted of nine determined students who also had to overcome their own set of obstacles. When challenged and told they wouldn't succeed in the traditional school system these students bet on themselves and found an educational environment that fit them. UHS is a Boston Collaborative High school that provides Boston students with the opportunity to reengage in their learning through an accelerated pathway and earn their high school diploma. The dedicated staff at UHS work with each student to ensure their educational needs are met and that they are set up to succeed.

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## Learning English While a Parent

Imagine moving to a new country as a parent and trying to support your young children with their education in a new culture. Now imagine facing this challenge when you are not yet fluent in the local language. Thousands of immigrant parents in Boston face this challenge every year. Fortunately, ABCD offers ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) for Parents and Caregivers classes with specific funding and curriculum support from English for New Bostonians (ENB) and the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

Founded in 2001 as a public-private-community collaborative spearheaded by the Boston Mayor's Office for Immigrant Advancement, English for New Bostonians has been independently incorporated since 2014. The organization funds ESOL programs, supports the development of specialized ESOL curricula, conducts research, and elevates immigrants' voices to advocate for greater funding for ESOL programs.

Program designed for underserved 13 year olds kicks off July 15th



Explaining how a good idea can be transformed into a law that changes lives for the better, Maia Raynor, legislative aide to State Senator Sonia Chang-Diaz, told a room full of 13 year olds that each of them can get involved and make a difference.

Raynor's presentation was part of ABCD's Youth Engaged in Action (YEA!) program last year. YEA!, a three-week summer adventure, introduces participants to people and experiences that teach them about civic engagement and leadership, online safety and responsibility, budgeting, job-readiness, community service.

As 2018 YEA! participant Victor Ramos puts it, "If you don't know these things, how would you be able to make your voice heard and help the community?"

This summer, YEA! kicks off on July 15<sup>th</sup> and includes an exciting new opportunity thanks to ABCD's new partner **DreamWakers**. Through online meetings called "flashchats," YEA! kids will interact with a variety of professionals from the private and public sector including a Google employee who leads the company's virtual reality initiatives and a staffer at the U.S. State Department.
