

ABCD: BY THE NUMBERS IN FISCAL YEAR 2025

ABCD assists low-income residents of Greater Boston to stabilize and improve their lives and move out of poverty by providing programs and services at its central offices and through a network of service centers. These services reached **102,126 individuals in 96,675 households** and included:

ASSET DEVELOPMENT: Assisted **3,611 households** with free tax prep and **1,475** with refunds/EITC.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH: ABCD Connect hotline supported **3,256 individuals** with referrals.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION: Helped **7,311 families** access child care; enrolled **2,328 children** in Head Start.

EDUCATION & CAREER DEVELOPMENT: Provided **17,877 individuals** with job assistance; **1,867** secured jobs. Helped **264** with ESOL and **60** earn degrees.

ELDER SERVICES: Served **259 seniors** hot meals, assisted **356** with independent living, and engaged **31** in wellness.

ENERGY ASSISTANCE: Helped **31,474 households** with LIHEAP, **2,987** with appliance weatherization, and **2,167 single families**, and **11,776** statewide intake and referrals.

ESSENTIAL SERVICES: Distributed **666,072 lbs. of food**, **1,251 families** received diapers, **510 households** got clothing, and **1,381 families** holiday meals. Donated toys to **818 children**; **138 families** in Adopt-a-Family.

FOOD SECURITY: Provided **1,001,040 meals**, served **2,880 families** at food pantries, and distributed food to **380 seniors**. Delivered groceries to **107 households**, **235** grocery giftcards, **91** mobile food pantries, served **1,381 holiday meals**, supported **141** at food pop-ups, and **82** secure food stamp benefits.

HEALTH SERVICES: Delivered care to **16,110 individuals** for disease prevention and reproductive health.

HOUSING & HOMELESSNESS: Assisted **122 households** with housing support, **261** with housing retention, and **107** with foreclosure prevention.

IMMIGRATION SERVICES: Helped **151** with fee waivers, **114** with citizenship applications, and **98** obtain citizenship. Assisted **50** with residency applications; **18** obtained residency.

YOUTH PROGRAMS: Supported **242 youth** in summer jobs, **154** in year-round jobs, and educated **96** in alternative high schools; **33** graduated.
